I thought the best plan was to acknowledge that from our early intimacy, and the kindness she had always shown me, I did take a great interest in her and that it was perhaps only my being sensible that she could neither look up to nor respect one so much younger than herself that prevented this feeling from ripening into a warmer attachment, but that I was old enough to be able to wish to promote her happiness even if I could not myself be the means of doing so, and that from what I had seen of her feelings towards him, I had always thought they might be happy together, and consequently had wished him success. He said that if she had any difficulty on this ground, nothing could be easier than to obviate it, for as far as he was concerned it would give him the greatest satisfaction to dispense with all formalities, except necessary settlements which he would take care should not occupy much time, and they might be quietly married at their own church in the neighbourhood without making any fuss about it; that with the exception of his mother and sister he had no relations he cared anything about or whom he would wish to be present so that Laura could have everything her own way

This work offers bibliographical descriptions of all printings of erotic fiction in English issued clandestinely during the period 1800-1930. By 'clandestine' is meant books whose publishers and printers attempt to hide their identities, usually by offering title pages whose misleading places and dates of publication may shock and amuse, but which always aim to mystify. Using internal and external evidence, an attempt is made to establish who were the printers, booksellers and publishers, English and Continental, involved in this trade. The printing families or 'groups' into which a large percentage of the material falls are classified, accompanied by illustrations which identify the main printing characteristics ('house styles') of the groups. Bibliographical descriptions follow a checklist of clandestine catalogues; these provide valuable evidence for dating, pricing and 'sales pitch' and information on items of which no copies can now be traced. The work concludes with a series of appendices which provide significant external evidence, and three indexes: of themes, titles and names. The novel was banned in the United States until a 1981 Justice Department ruling declared that its contents were not obscene. It was also banned in Turkey. The narrator Ashley Dvorak works in the personnel division of the paternal Longacre communications company. Although the narrator's experiences are highly sexual and at times non-consensual there has been some doubt over the years that the novel was meant to be a work of fiction and reads more like a memoir. Our young protagonist, of a virility to match his manhood, learns from randy maid Betsy that her Mistress and his childhood friend Laura oft steals away to a secret place to pleasure herself in the most solo of manners, his passions abound with lustful designs on the curious young woman. However Frank is not satisfied in solely seducing young Laura for he finds a like attraction towards her younger sibling, Master Frank. This erotic classic, anonymously written in 1890, is perhaps one of the most scandalous to emerge from the Victorian underground, where those of the predilection cavort indiscriminately of age, sex, or position. The present work fills a gap as it attempts to offer a history of erotic literature published in the United Kingdom. The word Study in the title is perhaps a bit exaggerated as the material is largely taken from the now well known bibliographies by Pisanus Fraxi (Henry Spencer Ashbee) and quotations from the books themselves. The time line is WW II. Who was the author? He may have been Charles Reginald Dawes (1879-1964) who is supposed to have written (but not published) a text of this or a similar title. His profession or his activities are not known - he once called himself a writer but library catalogues credit him only with two publications: *The Marquis de Sade* (Paris 1927) and *Retif de la Bretonne* (London 1946, privately printed). He may have been a popular writer under pseudonyms, though. Dawes owned a good erotica collection which he willed to the British Museum Library; that would explain why the author of this Study - if he was Dawes - could quote freely from erotic texts which only few of his contemporaries would have had available. The main merits of this book are that the author was thoroughly familiar with English (and French) erotic literature and that he put his material in chronological order and in context. The editor added a number of references, illustrations and indices of personal names and titles to facilitate navigation.

Thankfully, there are no animals involved, but almost every other taboo is broken. It's amusing to read all of the various euphemisms and analogies used to describe the sex in great detail. The story of a man's sexual trysts with his girlfriend, then her younger brother, and then all three of them together. Explicit sex scenes without the cuss words; lots of coy, flowery euphemisms of intimate body parts and sexual activities.. oh, yeah, he also gets seduced by the girl's fiancé. Not advised for children or people of high moral fiber (easily offended by depictions of moral depravity). The whole thing is completely ridiculous, but that's why it's able to be so much fun. And I have to say, there are parts where you forget to be disgusted, and it's pretty hot.

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"Frank" and I is one of the true classics of BDSM/flagellation erotica. "Frank" and I is the story of a young runaway teenager, "Frank" and a man "Charles," an upper-class Victorian era "thirty-something" bachelor. Frank becomes a good companion to Charles, but, as all teenagers will, the "boy" eventually falls afoul of his guardian, and Charles determines to give the boy a birching. In short order, with the boy's pants down the truth is discovered: "Frank" is a girl. "Frank" and I is a classic of Victorian erotica that should not be missed.

"Laura Middleton; her brother and her lover" is a Victorian erotica novel. It was first published in 1890 by an anonymous author. Although it does not contain a vulgar language, it contains graphic sexual descriptions and themes. The book gained its fame through sheer story telling, while short, it is noted as one of the best written Victorian era erotica novels.
